Should You Work Remote?



Prior to the CoronaVirus crisis, this was a question that was asked frequently in small businesses across the country. There has been a strong movement in the past decade of more and more workers in companies of all sizes working remotely from home. This trend has been driven by several factors including convenience, cost reduction, and better employee performance.

There have been a number of studies indicating that, on average, many employees are happier and more productive working from home. As a result, many companies (big and small) have allowed significant percentages of their employees to work from home either full-time or part-time.

But is working remote good for everyone?

Last week I had a phone conversation with the one expert I could count on to answer this question for me. Chuck Russell is the founder and Chief Knowledge Officer for the BestWorkData (BWD) company. For years, Chuck and his team have used online surveys to help managers make better decisions on hiring, training, and managing their employees. Personally, I have used the BWD surveys for over 10 years with my clients.

During our phone conversation, Chuck shared with me that their research indicates about one-third of the working population enjoys working remotely and performs better from home. Another third of this same working population

struggles with being employed at home. They are not happy working from home, and they are less productive.

As a small business leader, how do you know where your employees fall within this research? In most cases, the

simplest answer is that we don't know, possibly until it's too late. Employee performance declines. Their engagement drops as well. They become disgruntled. Then they leave us. Or worse...they stay.

Is there a way to know beforehand if a particular employee should be working remotely? I believe there are several ways:
